SINGAPORE, 06 MAY 2024: In recent times, natural disasters and human calamities have been frequent, and Singapore has entered a period of hot and rainy weather. The escalation of situations in Ukraine and the Middle East, along

with casualties and displacements of populations from various corners of the world, indirectly affect our daily concerns such as inflation pressure.

Every second Sunday of May, Tzu Chi gathers the benevolent thoughts of over a hundred thousand people worldwide to pray for the world. This day marks Tzu Chi's "3-in-1" occasion of Buddha Day, Mother's Day, and Global Tzu Chi Day. Followers of various religions are invited to express their gratitude for the Buddha, parents, and all sentient beings, while also uniting their compassionate thoughts to pray for world peace.

We foresee nearly a thousand of similar celebrations to be held in nearly 50 countries and territories. Among these celebration, the upcoming one in Singapore is one of the few held in an outdoor stadium, showcasing a solemn group formation of thousands of volunteers.

Mr. Teo Chee Hean, Senior Minister and Coordinating Minister for National Security, will serve as the guest of honour for the fifth time, along with other guests including:

- 1. Ms. Low Yen Ling, Mayor of Southwest District;
- 2. Ms. Hany Soh Hui Bin, Member of Parliament for Marsiling-Yew Tee GRC;
- 3. Mr. Liang Eng Hwa, Member of Parliament for Bukit Panjang SMC;
- 4. Mr. Yeo Guat Kwang, Advisor of the National Trades Union Congress;
- Mr. Teo Ho Bin, Chairperson of the Traditional Chinese Medicine Practitioners Board, and
- 6. Mr. Tung Chen Yuan, Representative of the Taipei Representative Office in Singapore.

Local dignitaries, representatives from the Inter-Religious Organisation and Dharma masters will lead the event, which is expected to see nearly three thousand participants joining the Buddha-bathing ceremony and prayer session. Here are some suggested stories that can be covered:

- Four elderly participants in their eighties overcome challenges such as the
 hot weather and physical exertion to conduct a one-hour rehearsal and
 participate in the two-hour actual event on the same day, collectively
 presenting the solemnity of religious humanity.
- 2. A group of old classmates that participates in this event every year.
- 3. Volunteers from different nationalities join the formation together.
- 4. A family that has attended the event for 11 years, irrespective of weather condition.


